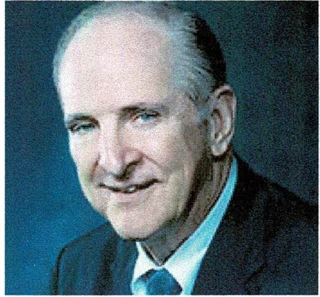

U. S. CONGRESSMAN SAM JOHNSON



Sam Johnson returned home to Texas after serving in the U.S. Air Force for 29 years as a highly decorated pilot. He flew combat missions in both the Korean and Vietnam Wars and was a prisoner of war in Hanoi for nearly seven years. After his military career, he established a home-building business and served in the Texas Legislature. In 1991, he embarked on a new mission of service representing the 3rd District of Texas in the United States Congress.

Johnson grew up in Dallas and after graduating from SMU began his 29-year career in the U. S. Air Force. He served as director of the Air Force Fighter Weapons School (Top Gun) and flew with the Air Force Thunderbirds precision flying demonstration team. In the Korean War, Johnson flew F-86s in 62 combat missions.

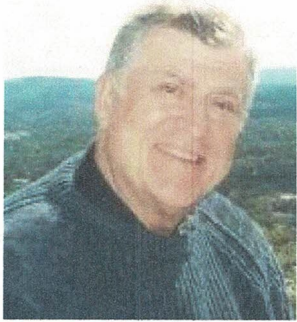
In the Vietnam War, Johnson flew F-4s. While flying his 25th combat mission in 1966, he was shot down over North Vietnam. He spent nearly seven years as a prisoner of war, half of that time in solitary confinement. Fellow POW Capt. James Mulligan (USN-Ret.) recalled the day Johnson was allowed to return to a joint cell. He walked into the room with the two other American officers, "stood at attention with tears in his eyes, and said simply, 'Lieutenant Colonel Sam Johnson reporting for duty Sir' ... after he had not talked to or directly been with an American for three full years." Johnson recounts the details of his POW experience in his autobiography, *Captive Warriors*. A decorated war hero, Johnson was awarded two Silver Stars, two Purple Hearts, four Air Medals, and three Outstanding Unit Awards.

Sam Johnson is married to the former Shirley L. Melton. They are proud parents of three children and grandparents to 10.

During the Korean War, the new F-86s were the best fighters in the sky. Pilots kept the same plane in which he chanced death each day, many became very superstitious. The fighter plane and pilot formed a unique bond, a very close relationship. Some approached the plane in exact sequence of the previous successful flight. Others caressed the plane in the exact spot each flight, just a gentle pet. Lt. Col. Johnson chose to show his pride and support of a loving wife at home and named his plane, "Shirley's Texas Tornado."

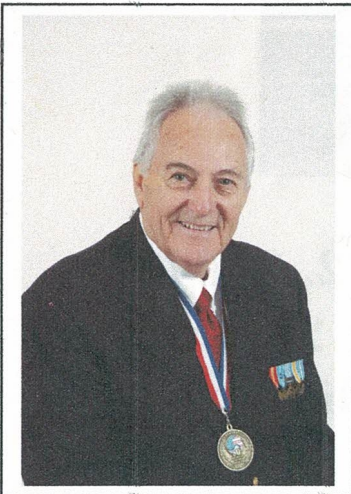

ALLEN B. CLARK

Allen received the Purple Heart for shrapnel wounds at Dak To Special Forces camp in South Vietnam where he served as a Military Intelligence Officer assigned to 5th Special Forces Group. His injury required amputation of both legs below the knee, but he walks today on artificial legs unaided by walking devices. Allen graduated from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point and was commissioned originally in the Army Corps of Engineers. He volunteered for service in the Republic of Vietnam and was recognized with receipt of the Silver Star for gallantry in action, Combat Infantryman Badge and Vietnam Campaign Ribbon with two battle stars. Allen served on the state level during 1979-1981 as a Special Assistant for Administration to Texas Governor William P. Clements, Jr. In 1989 he was nominated by President George H. W. Bush and confirmed by the U. S. Senate as Assistant Secretary for Veterans Liaison. In 1991, he received his second VA confirmation as Director of the National Cemetery System. Allen retired from VA as Public Affairs Officer at VA North Texas Health Care System in 2005, where he previously served as Administrative Officer for Spinal Cord Injury Center and Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation Service. Allen is an author and wrote his autobiography, *Wounded Soldier, Healing Warrior* in 2006.



BRUCE WOODWARD

Bruce joined the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve (1st Marine Air Wing VMF 312) at the age of 17, while still going to high school in Los Angeles, CA. In June 1950 he completed his first year of college, was married, then called to active duty and sent overseas when the Korean War broke out. He arrived in Osaka, Japan in July and sent to Korea after the Inchon landing. Bruce helped to secure Kimpo Air Field, so our F4U "Corsairs" Fighter Planes could land. Shortly thereafter he was sent to Wonsan Airfield in North Korea to help prepare that airfield. Bruce was in intelligence & logistics and worked directly with the squadron commander and pilots. Bruce's squadron gave "close air" support to the 1st

Marine Division and other UN troops during the "Chosin Reservoir" campaign and other battles in 1951.

After active duty in 1952, Bruce was an Independent newspaper distributor for the *Los Angeles Times*, with the Los Angeles Dodgers Baseball Club and ran the Farm Clubs in Omaha, NE and Albuquerque, NM, and in sales management for Combined Insurance Company. He started his own company with his two sons in Dallas and presently has his own company, Sales Merchandising & Consulting. He also serves as President of the Chosin Few – North Texas Chapter.

Born in Bellflower, IL, at the beginning of WWII he returned to complete high school in 1946. He graduated from Illinois State U. in 1950 and began military service for brief time as a Navy Aviation Cadet. He enlisted in the Army 5 July 1951 at Ft. Leonard Wood, MO and was commissioned a 2dLt 1 August 1952 at Ft Benning, GA. After Airborne and Jumpmaster school, he served with the 11th Airborne Division, 503rd Infantry Regiment as a platoon leader, Ft. Campbell, KY. He received orders to Korea early 1953 and was assigned to 2nd Infantry Division, 23rd Infantry Regiment, Company "C" as a platoon leader on the central front. After combat on Outpost Harry at the time of the Armistice 27 July 1953, he served as 23rd Infantry Special Service Officer, returned to the U.S., left the Army, and completed a Master of Education Degree at the University of Arizona in 1955. A return to the Army Reserve led to six years of Artillery School and the Army Ranger Course in 1960.

After three years of seminary, graduating from Perkins School of Theology, S.M.U., transferred from Infantry to the Chaplain Corps in 1964. He served the next 24 years with Engineer and Hospital units, retired at Ft. Leavenworth, KS in 1988 with 36 years total service.

Chaplain Smith and wife, Alice have been residents of Irving since 1974. They have 2 sons and 1 daughter, and 5 grandchildren. Chaplain Smith served as the first full-time Chaplain at Irving Community Hospital from 1980 to 1997, retiring after it became Baylor Hospital. He is a Baylor Volunteer and a JROTC Substitute in 5 local high schools.

TOWN NORTH CONCERT BAND

Town North Concert Band (TNCB) was established in 1964 and has been in continuous operation for over thirty-seven years. The 50-plus members of the all-volunteer ensemble are dedicated to providing community service in the Greater Dallas area by presenting music concerts in a variety of settings.

The repertoire of TNCB ranges from traditional show tunes, patriotic show tunes, and patriotic marches to dramatic works written for the contemporary wind symphony. The ensemble participates in the Memorial Day Dallas ceremony hosted by Restland Memorial Park, and other performances include public and private schools, neighborhood association events throughout the area, nursing homes and health care facilities, as well as area festivals.

Members of TNCB range in age from retired seniors to students entering college. Many are school music directors and former professional musicians, as well as doctors, homemakers, business administrators, and other professionals who dedicate their time to rehearsing and performing with the ensemble. Two of the founding members still participate with the group.

Class Act

Class Act Tap Company was founded 22 years ago as a service organization. During that time the dance members have performed over 1,535 shows in the DFW and surrounding North Texas areas, including national and state conventions, civic events, charity events, private parties, retirement and nursing homes, senior citizen events, clubs meetings, banquets and parades. The average age of this unique group is 62 years.
